


## Multiplication Table of 12



# 12 Tables

$$\begin{aligned}12 \times 1 &= 12 \\12 \times 2 &= 24 \\12 \times 3 &= 36 \\12 \times 4 &= 48 \\12 \times 5 &= 60 \\12 \times 6 &= 72 \\12 \times 7 &= 84 \\12 \times 8 &= 96 \\12 \times 9 &= 108 \\12 \times 10 &= 120\end{aligned}$$

$$\begin{aligned}12 \times 11 &= 132 \\12 \times 12 &= 144 \\12 \times 13 &= 156 \\12 \times 14 &= 168 \\12 \times 15 &= 180 \\12 \times 16 &= 192 \\12 \times 17 &= 204 \\12 \times 18 &= 216 \\12 \times 19 &= 228 \\12 \times 20 &= 240\end{aligned}$$
